### COWICHAN FORAY 2023 INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION FORM

The Registration form reflects the information required from the Foray participants. It has changed slightly to allow for additional participants, room sharing, foray terrain accessibility and a half day on site workshop.

The quality of leaders and experts is as always, beyond reproach.

The Cowichan Foray (CF) will be headquartered on the same site as last year, the Cowichan Lake Education Centre (CLEC).

The Cowichan Valley area contains a variety of terrains conducive to providing a variety of fungi in their natural habitat. This often requires traversing fallen logs, rugged trails and inclines. The foray groups will be pre-assigned to accommodate as much diversity as possible for the participants.

BC Parks has again approved SVIMS access to the Gordon Bay Campgrounds, in order to collect fungi specimens for study and analysis. This area has a diverse terrain but more importantly is relatively level and easy access to the fungi world. This allows a safer location for participants, that might find traversing fallen trees, gullies, steep inclines etc. a bit too challenging. (PLEASE INDICATE A BY CIRCULATING "YES" ON THE REGISTRATION FORM IF YOU PREFER SUCH A LOCATION).

FRIDAY - October 27

3:00 – 7:00 PM - Arrival of weekend participants at CLEC site, check in; obtain room allocation.

6:00 - ?? - Social time in Grand Hall – meet the other participants and leaders.

### **SATURDAY – October 28**

8:00 – 8:30 AM - Arrival of day participants at CLEC site and check in.

8:30 – 11:30 AM -All assemble into designated foray group, meet leaders and depart to foray area.

8:30 – 12:00 - WORKSHOP REGISTRANTS – after assembly, workshop held in a conference room.

11:30 – 12:00 PM – Foray groups return to CLEC site and drop off fungi specimens at Carmanah Hall.

1:00 – 4:00 PM – All assemble into designated foray group, meet leaders and depart to foray area. (Some participants have already been designated to assist the experts in identifying the morning fungi collection. Other participants can volunteer to work with this group also. This will occur in the Carmanah Hall) 3:30 – 4:30 PM – Foray groups return to CLEC site and drop off fungi specimens at Carmanah Hall, browse the display tables of assembled fungi from the morning foray.

4:30 – 5:00 PM – Day participants depart.

5:00 – 6:00 PM – Dinner for the weekend participants in the Grand Hall.

6:00 - ?? - Social time in Grand Hall – meet other participants and leaders.

#### **SUNDAY – October 29**

8:30 – 10:30 AM – Assemble in the Carmanah Hall with the weekend participants and leaders to review, analyze and discussion fungi collected during Saturday's forays.

10:30 - 11:00 AM - Depart CLEC facility

# **FULL WEEKEND PARTICIPANTS**

A full weekend fee includes 2 nights of accommodation, 2 breakfasts, a lunch and a dinner. Complete the Food Allergy information box if this applies to you.

<u>Room Accommodation</u>. We will be offering the weekend participants some room sharing options. The reduced registration fee for each option reflects these savings.

There are a limited number of private single rooms. These rooms include two single beds and a private bathroom. A few of these single rooms will not

require sharing but the remainder are to be shared. The registration fees reflect the savings if sharing.

The two dorms are split between male and female participants. Each dorm has a common washroom. Each dorm has 5 rooms varying in size, essentially 3 that can accommodate up to 4 participants and 2 that can accommodate 6-8 participants. In order to provide a degree of privacy we will limit the smaller rooms to 2 participants and 4 to the larger rooms.

If you are participating with friends in the CF and want to share a dorm room with them, please indicate their last name in the "Share With" box of the registration form. If you want to share a dorm room but are not part of a group, please enter N/A in the "Shared With" box and we will assign you to an available room.

the terrain the fungi might be located in. The morning session starts at 8:30 AM and the afternoon session at 1:00 PM. The fee is \$60/participant.

In past, an option to order a separate hot lunch was made available to the Day Participants. This option is available for 2023 but the increased fee from CLEC is \$44/participant. If you select this option please circle the \$44 fee and include with your payment. Also, complete the "food allergy" section. In the past many Day Participants have brought their own lunch. All participants can eat their meals in the main cafeteria. This allows for dry conditions should it rain but also the opportunity to socialize with all participants and leaders.

## HALF DAY WORKSHOP

This morning workshop and presentation will be geared to beginners, in order to provide them the opportunity to identify and study the many fungi in the Pacific Northwest. Fungi samples will be available for handling and discussion. The participants will then be assigned to one of the afternoon Foray groups. This workshop will be taught by the SVIMS President, Melanie Hess. The work shop is open to both Weekend and Day participants.
